**Chicago Telephone Company's  
Four Party Line Western Electric Type 85 F Nickel Payphone  
By Tom Adams ATCA #213**

Thought some of you might like to see my newest restoration. This was quite time consuming but a labor of love. I truly enjoy restoring a phone like this back to its original state and especially when I can salvage most of the factory finish.

This photo shows the phone as I received it.



As you can see it was missing parts, the large condenser, older style 242 transmitter arm, pony receiver, and last, but not least, the original style Chicago Telephone Company 7A nickel coin box. Fortunately, I had them on hand and had been saving them for a special telephone.

I was able to restore 95% of the old finish which had years of dirt, grime, smoke, etc on it. I did this using a method that I had never before used and one that I have not heard of anyone else using. I took an old wash cloth, dipped a corner in household ammonia and rubbed small sections at a time being careful not to rub off the old finish until I had cleaned the entire wooden case. To my amazement, this process took off all the dirt, etc. leaving the original finish with its old patina. I followed up with a rub down with Howard's walnut Restore-a-Finish, then a coat of Feed-n-Wax, and last a good coat of furniture paste wax. I then had to match the shelf I had to the old original finish of the phone.



The transmitter arm had literally been pulled or jerked off the phone leaving large walled out mounting holes. These had to be drilled out and plugged in order to remount the transmitter arm.



It was obvious from the wiring grooves on the backboard and two plugged wire holes, the phone had originally been equipped with the earlier 242 transmitter arm.





Another challenge was to match the original shelf I had (which had been stripped of its original finish) to this phone's finish. I was able to get pretty close with red mahogany stain finished with a couple coats of Bulls Eye Amber Shellac.

Thanks to a couple of other collectors, Mike Zyla, Steph Kerman, & Rob Honeycutt, I was able to obtain a copy of the Illinois Bell Telephone Co. Engineering Bulletin No. 108 containing the circuit diagram for this telephone. With this information and their help, I was able to wire it back to factory specifications. The phone was factory modified for an extension bell, which I'm fairly certain is why the SPL 85Y stamp is on the inside.

This phone contains a couple of unusual parts that I had not seen before which are required for the four party ringer circuit. A 48,000 ohm resistor and a 1000 ohm ringer with 3000 ohm resistance in circuit with the 2 M.F. condenser.

"The history of telephony in Chicago would long be dominated by firms that traced their lineage back to Bell. These firms included the Chicago Telephone Company, the dominant Chicago firm at the turn of the twentieth century, and Illinois Bell, which absorbed Chicago Telephone in 1920. Both of these companies were pillars of the "Bell System," the national telephone network that was coordinated after 1900 by American Telephone and Telegraph (AT&T).

For Chicagoans who lacked the inclination or means to subscribe to telephone service, the "nickel-in-the-slot" pay telephone provided a welcome alternative. Beginning around 1900, such devices could be found in thousands of drugstores, hotels, and other public places. A favorite of bookies and gangsters, they have been immortalized in dozens of Hollywood movies."

## THE CHICAGO DAILY NEWS

Almanac and Year Book for 1909

### CHICAGO TELEPHONE ORDINANCE AND RATES.

Passed by city council Nov. 6, 1907.

The Chicago Telephone company is authorized to operate its telephone wires in the city until Jan. 1, 1925. Its books and records are to be open for examination by the city comptroller and its accounts may be audited for the purpose of verifying the statement of gross receipts, of which 3 per cent is to be paid into the city treasury as compensation for the franchise. The city is to have free telephone service. The city reserves to itself the right to change the rates or tolls from time to time and to modify the rules and regulations. It is provided, however, that such changes shall not be made to continue for a period of more than six or less than five years. The company shall not make any rate agreements or division of territory with any other company. The right to purchase the plant of the company on Jan. 1, 1919, or Jan. 1, 1924, is reserved to the city, the price to be fixed by appraisers. The maximum rates fixed by the ordinance are as follows:

#### BUSINESS TELEPHONES.

##### PLAT RATE.

For a single-party line with the right to the unlimited use of the same, \$15 a year.

##### MEASURED RATE.

For a single-party line, including 1,500 outgoing conversations or messages, \$6 a year. For the next 2,400 outgoing messages, or any part thereof, during the year, 1 cent each. For all outgoing messages in excess of 3,900 during the year, 2 cents each.

Every subscriber who will contract to pay for 1,500 outgoing messages a year at the above rates shall be furnished with a second single-party line without extra charge, and every subscriber shall be furnished with an additional single-party line without extra charge for each 6,000 outgoing messages he will contract to pay for, in addition to the 1,500 during the year at the rate of 2 cents each.

A single-party line or lines, including the right to transmit outgoing messages without limit and without any charge per message, shall be furnished at \$1 per day each. Subscribers to single-party lines at this rate shall be deemed subscribers to measured service. Every subscriber to measured service shall also be furnished with an any single-party lines as he may demand at the rate of \$6 per quarter for each line.

#### RESIDENCE TELEPHONES.

For a single-party line, including all outgoing messages, 118 per quarter.

For a 100-party line, \$14 per quarter.

#### NICKEL PREPAID SERVICE.

Nickel prepayment service with outgoing messages at 5 cents each, as follows:

One-party line, at a guaranty of 20 cents a day, including four messages.

Two-party line, at a guaranty of 12½ cents a day, including two and a half messages.

Four-party line, for residences only, at a guaranty of 5 cents per day, including one message.

#### PUBLIC TELEPHONE SERVICE.

The charge for a single conversation or message from any telephone in Chicago to any other telephone in the city shall not exceed 5 cents.

#### NEIGHBORHOOD EXCHANGE SERVICE.

The company may maintain local or neighborhood exchanges and shall establish them wherever the city council may direct. Any subscriber in any such exchange may communicate with any telephone within the city limits outside the neighborhood district, for which a charge of 5 cents may be made for each period of 3 minutes or fraction thereof. The rates per month for local exchange service, including all outgoing messages under yearly contracts, shall not exceed the following:

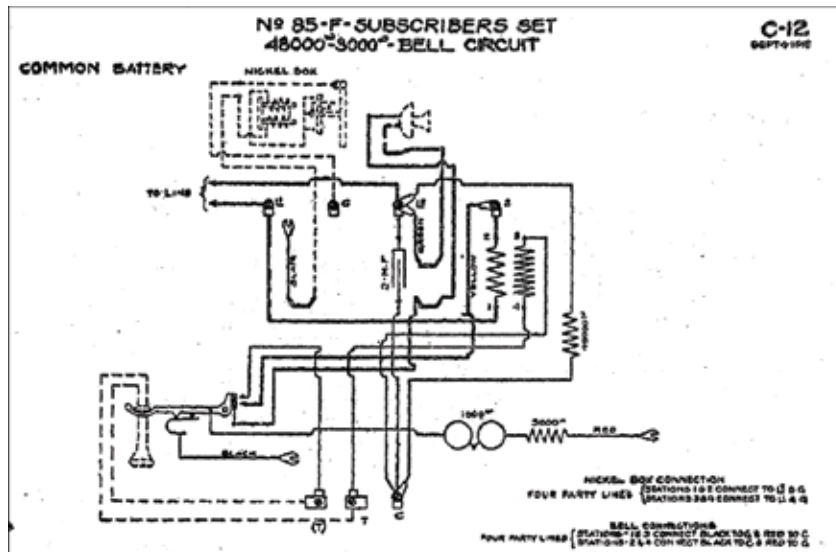
Line.	Business.	Residence.
One-party .....	\$4.00	\$3.50
Two-party .....	2.00	2.50
Four-party .....	2.00	1.50

#### TOLL SERVICE.

The company shall not charge more than 30 cents for each conversation or message up to three minutes (and not more than 5 cents for each additional minute), transmitted from any telephone in Chicago to any other telephone outside the city but within fifteen miles of the present city limit, or within one mile of the city limits and within the state of Illinois.

#### METERS.

The company shall install in connection with each measured-service line of its subscribers a meter which shall prove effective in actual use for accurately recording the number of outgoing messages over the line.
