General Electric liquidated the Peel-Conner Company 1921

REMARKS General Electric Company established a plant in Salford, England known as Peel Works because it overlooked Peel Park. After Merritt Conner, a former employee of Bell Telephone, he greatly improved the line of telephones that were produced and he was promoted to plant manager. In 1910 he negotiated with General Electric to incorporate the factory as a separate telephone manufacturing company called Peel-Conner Tel Works
