# ATTACHMENT WORLD

This month's featured attachment is a very unique one among many, many more common styles. It is a battery-powered, lighted writing pad made to attach to a deskstand, often referred to as a candlestick telephone.

We have in the past featured one or two unique types, but this one is even more unique when one considers that it was battery-powered at a time when batteries were probably not used for much more than flashlights due to cost and availability. This is pure conjecture on my part as I have no data to support the statement other than personal knowledge.

There is no information on the lighted writing pad, belonging to long time telephone collector, Dick Erickson, so I can't provide any patent dates. Inasmuch as it was made to attach to the "standard" diameter deskstand shaft, I'm going to assume that this battery-powered type did not surface until 1915 or after. Perhaps there is a reader who can provide more accurate information?

The construction of the writing pad base provides for battery storage below the writing surface and a shaded lamp attached by a flexible arm to the battery compartment. I suspect that two batteries of the "AA or C" type were used and that the lamp was 3 volts.

In addition to the lighted pad, I have pictured a unique unlighted pad also belonging to Dick Erickson. It has a paper pad with an interesting cover, possibly patriotic in nature, that appears to be original. The other writing pad is my own and was issued by Shell Oil Company. It is new old stock and almost vertical when attached to the deskstand, a position unique to most writing pad attachments. I have several other writing pads, from those advertising bread to those touting the services of the local undertaker.

## PHONRITE BOTH HANDS FREE

The Phonrite is a new invention, providing a clasp in which a telephone receiver may be *instantly placed and instantly removed* and which holds it to the ear so that the mouth is close to the transmitter at a most effective speaking angle, permitting clear cut distinctness to every word without muffling the voice (as when speaking directly into the mouth-piece).

The main object of the Phonrite is to give entire freedom of *both hands* when telephoning, which is a great convenience in writing and in opening books, letters, etc.

It also rests the arm from the awkward tiring position of holding a receiver, when delays occur, or when one is engaged in long conversations.

It provides a safe and handy place to put the receiver when calling others to the phone and thus prevents its falling from desk or stand and the breaking of many telephones and receivers, which is also the case when trying to hold a receiver on the arm or shoulder, when both hands are needed.



## THE ATTACHMENT CORNER

This candlestick attachment allows for a hands free use of the phone. It is made by the Patent Products Co., Battle Creek, Mich. It is black japanned paint over steel. It is mounted around the transmitter and tightened with a small knurled nut. The receiver is slid into the other end and is easily removed so it can be placed back on the receiver hook. This one is new old stock and complete with a marked box. This is the only one of these that I have seen.

## PHONRITE *Both Hands Free*




## PHONRITE DIRECTIONS

The telephone should always be placed on a flat surface. Tilt transmitter backward and tighten. Place Phonrite on transmitter from back of telephone and turn arm to a point where the ear easily adjusts to the receiver when leaning forward over your desk in a writing position and tighten by using thumb nut. To most conveniently use the Phonrite, place the telephone in front of you and turn it sideways, so that you will speak into the mouth piece at an angle, this position gives unobstructed vision (of both eyes) in writing which is not obtained otherwise. The Phonrite may be used for either right or left ear.

The Clasp which holds receiver is *not* intended to rotate, it is placed in correct position at factory and bolted tight.

By removing receiver from hook with back of hand toward you, or by placing receiver on hook with large end up, makes it easier to place in clasp and easier to remove. When finished speaking *always remove receiver from clasp* (by tipping it either upward or downward) and return to hook in the regular way.
