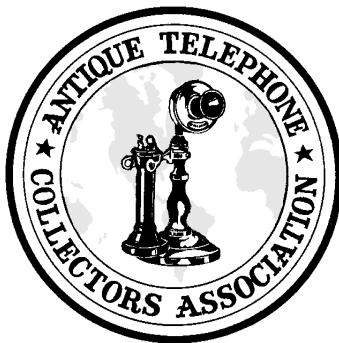

## THE CANDLESTICK TELEPHONE HOLDER with NOTEPAD



This telephone attachment is quite unique. It is made to hold a candlestick telephone and a notepad and pencil / pen. It also has a place to put the receiver when off hook. I guess it's an early telephone organizer of sorts. It appears that this piece probably sat on a table or desk, maybe in a hotel room, or at a business and is meant to attach to the wall behind it so that it is more permanent. It is made of cast iron painted black and it is marked underneath "M-25, 1887, 1". I don't know if that is the patent date, which sounds pretty early for this piece.

This is the only one that I have ever seen so I'd have to think it to be quite rare.

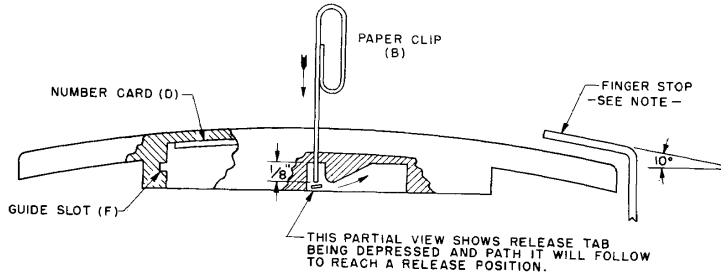
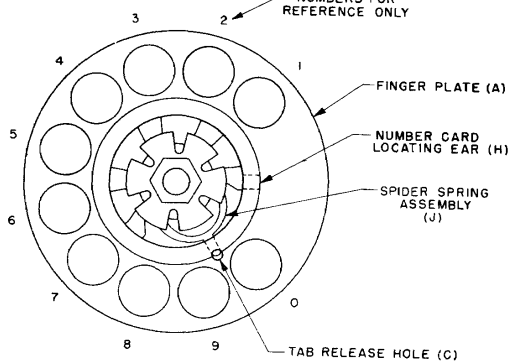
Address or telephone number recording devices range from the very simple to the mechanically complex. I have featured a variety of types in previous articles, but none like this one. In fact, I have never seen another like this cardboard type with removable alphabetical cards for ease of recording information.

This example has neither manufacturer nor advertiser identification. It does have a short verse imprinted on the front in limerick style:

So many phones, so many calls,  
So many numbers gone astray-  
Just keep these slips

At your finger tips;  
Twill prove the better way.

This particular example is obviously new old stock, and nothing has been recorded on any of the cards. I have chosen to display it on an early A.E. wall set where I imagine it might have been used. More attachments and “go-withs” will be coming your way in future issues.



## NUMBER CARD ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

### A. REMOVAL OF FINGER PLATE

REVOLVE THE FINGER PLATE (A) IN A CLOCKWISE DIRECTION AS FAR AS IT WILL GO. THEN INSERT ONE END OF AN OPENED PAPER CLIP (B) INTO THE TAB RELEASE HOLE (C) AND DEPRESS THE TAB APPROXIMATELY 1/8". WITH THE LOCKING TAB DEPRESSED, CONTINUE TO TURN THE FINGER PLATE IN A CLOCKWISE DIRECTION UNTIL A SECOND STOP IS REACHED. REMOVE THE PAPER CLIP (B) AND LIFT THE FINGER PLATE FROM THE DIAL.

### B. REMOVAL OF NUMBER CARD

TO REMOVE THE NUMBER CARD, THE FINGER PLATE MUST FIRST BE REMOVED AS OUTLINED UNDER 'A'. THEN TURN THE FINGER PLATE ASSEMBLY OVER, AND REMOVE CARD.

### C. ASSEMBLY OF NUMBER CARD

PLACE THE NUMBER CARD (D) IN THE FINGER PLATE (A). NOTE THAT THE NOTCH OF CARD FITS INTO A LOCATING EAR (H) OF THE FINGER PLATE.

### D. ASSEMBLY OF FINGER PLATE

PLACE THE FINGER PLATE (A) SQUARELY OVER THE SPIDER SPRING ASSEMBLY (J) ON THE DIAL WITH THE NO. 10 HOLE OF THE FINGER PLATE (A) DIRECTLY OVER THE CENTER OF THE NO. 9 DOT ON THE NUMERAL RING. TURN THE FINGER PLATE (A) FIRMLY IN A COUNTER-CLOCKWISE DIRECTION UNTIL THE FINGER PLATE (A) LOCKS IN PLACE.

NOTE: WHEN REPLACING FLAT FINGER PLATE WITH CURVED TOP FINGER PLATE, BEND FINGER STOP APPROXIMATELY 10° AS SHOWN, OR REPLACE WITH BENT UP FINGER STOP.

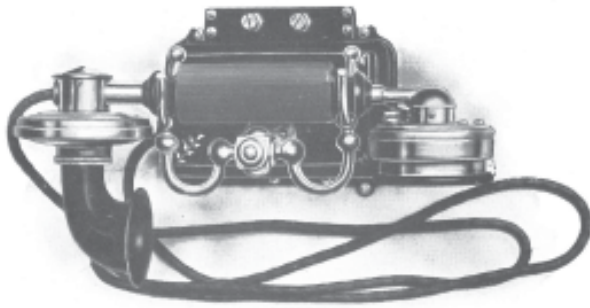

are made so substantial as to eliminate troubles to a minimum. The receiver is fastened to the handle or support of the instrument by means of a ball and socket joint. The distance from the transmitter to the receiver may be varied by moving the tube, which extends inside of the handle, in or out. The instrument is supported in a pronged hookswitch, gracefully and substantially built with all wiring parts concealed. The instrument when placed upon the hookswitch rests in a horizontal position and occupies very small space, which makes the instrument very practical for desk use, it being possible to mount the instrument inside of a roll-top desk, where space is valuable but where it is desired to have the instrument very handy, and also so situated as to be free from meddlesome hands when the owner is not present. The base in which the hookswitch is mounted is made of metal, neatly japanned and finished with gold striping. In Fig. 2 is shown this instrument mounted in a little different manner, being supported vertically by a pronged hookswitch; otherwise, the instrument is the same as the one previously described.

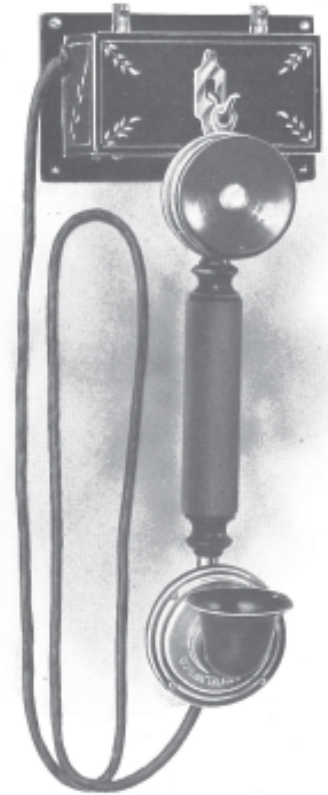

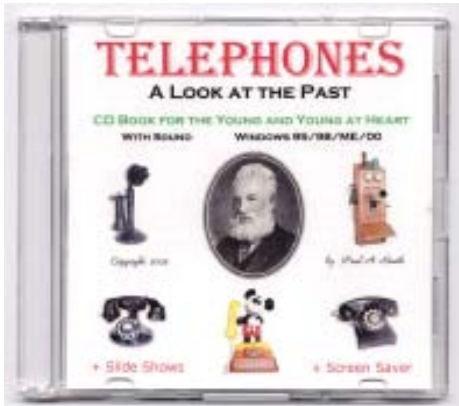

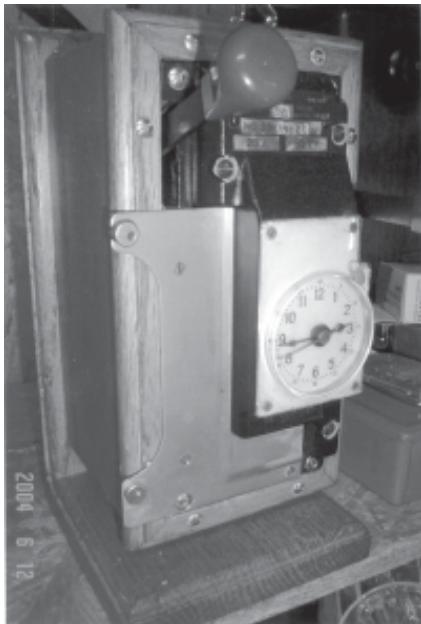
