The gongs are mounted on hard wood bases and are finished either in quarter oak, cherry, or mahogany, as desired. Write for bulletin.

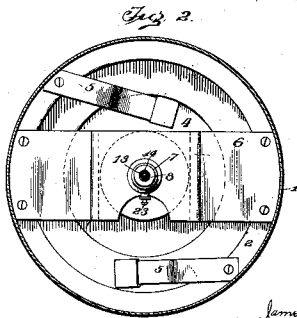
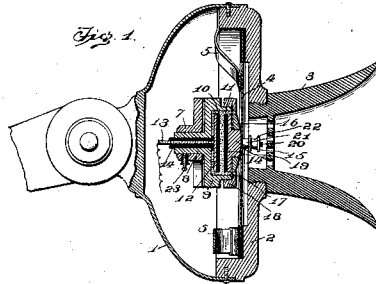

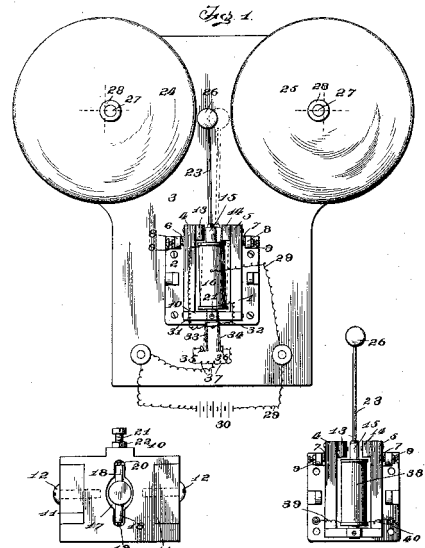
